

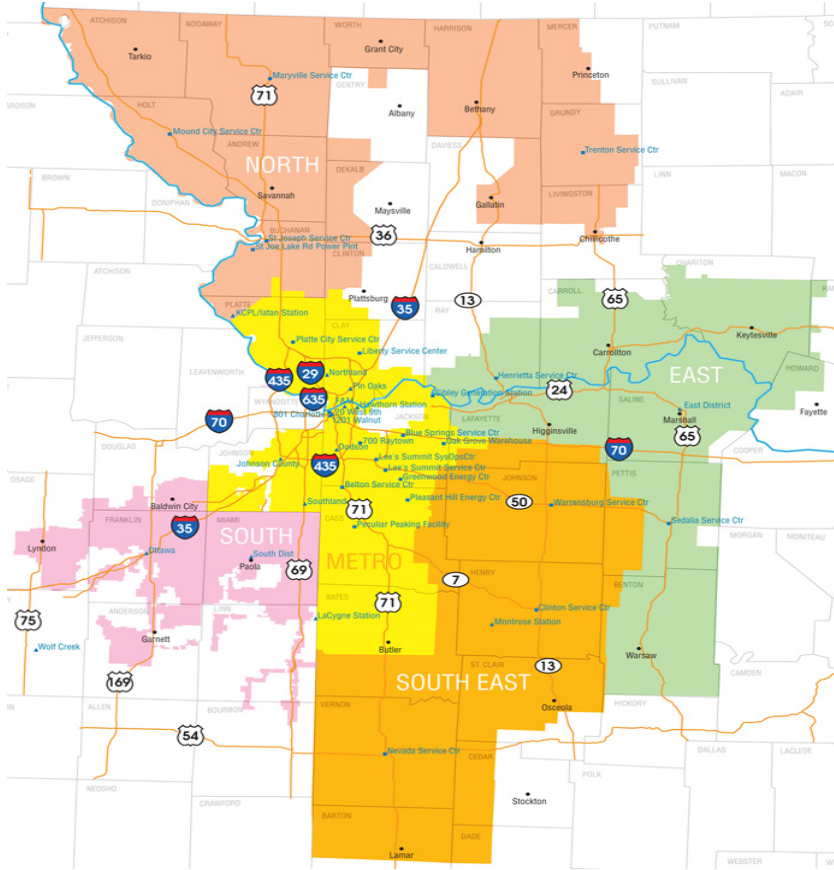

KCP&L Overview



- Founded in 1882
- Serving approximately 800,000 customers in 47 counties in Missouri and Kansas
- Facilities include:
 - Nine plant sites
 - Twenty-six generating units
 - Ten peaking facilities
- Generating capacity of over 6,100 megawatts
- Approximately 26 million megawatt hours of electricity generated annually



Customer Programs



- **Budget Billing**
 - Averages your payment throughout the year to eliminate seasonal highs and lows in your electric bill and makes it easier to budget.
- **Adjustable Due Date**
 - Customers receiving Social Security or governmental disability income may be eligible to change the due date of their electric bill to better coincide with the receipt of their benefits.
- **Medical Program**
 - KCP&L's Medical Customer Program is intended for customers who are homebound and rely on electrical medical- or life-support equipment that does not have a power backup supply. We will document your specialized needs in our system and provide you with a dedicated phone number for reporting your outages.

- Builders/Developer Incentive Program
 - Promote energy efficiency measures for homes provided to low-income customers
 - Includes single-family and low-rise multifamily homes
 - Includes home ownership or rental properties
 - Includes new construction or full-rehabilitation
- Up to \$1500 In Rebates for Implementation of Energy Star® Measures
 - \$800 toward energy-efficient central cooling equipment (14 SEER or greater)
 - \$400 toward insulation upgrades R42 Attic, R25 Floor or R19 Crawlspace
 - \$200 toward an Energy Star-rated refrigerator
 - \$100 toward Energy Star-rated lighting fixtures
- How Do I Participate?
 - Complete an Affordable New Homes Application
 - Provide proof of installation of applicable measures



- Free Program to Low-Income Customers to Provide Energy Efficiency Measures
 - Promote energy efficiency measures for homes of low-income customers
 - Includes home owners or renters
 - Weatherization services provided by local Community Action Partners (Missouri Valley Community Action Agency)
- Benefits of Weatherization
 - May reduce heating and cooling bills by as much as 31% annually
 - Resolve energy-efficiency concerns before energy bills get out of control
 - Money saved on energy bills can be used for other household expenses
- Typical Weatherization Services
 - Installing insulation
 - Caulking windows and doors
 - Sealing air infiltration
 - Repairs/replacement to heating and central cooling systems.



- Eligibility
 - Earnings at or below the 200% of Federal Poverty Guideline.
 - Owner of the home has received electric service from KCP&L for a minimum of one year immediately preceding the date of application
 - Household energy consumption greater than 3,000 kWh per year
 - Applicant has made attempts to maintain a payment history, no matter how small w Homes Application
 - Renters
 - must receive approval from Landlord
 - Landlord must agree to pay for 50% of installed measures
 - Landlord must agree not to raise rent for two years
