

CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF JANUARY 25, 2016

A meeting of the Warrensburg City Council was held on January 25, 2016, at 7:00 p.m. at the Municipal Center, 200 S. Holden, with Mayor Robin Allen presiding. Roll was called as follows: Present were: DeFrain, Jacobs, Rutt, Renfrow, Allen. Absent: none.

Minutes of the January 11, 2016, City Council meeting were considered. DeFrain moved to approve the minutes of the January 11, 2016, City Council meeting. Yes: DeFrain, Jacobs, Renfrow, Allen. Abstained: Rutt. Absent: none.

The adoption of the agenda was considered. Rutt moved to adopt the agenda. Yes: DeFrain, Jacobs, Rutt, Renfrow, Allen. No: none.

Bill No. 1-8-16 being for an Ordinance Declaring the Results of the Canvas of Statements of Candidacy and Establishing a General Election to be Held on April 5, 2016, was read for the first time by title. City Clerk Cindy Gabel said the Municipal Election will be held on April 5, 2016, and six candidates have filed for two three-year positions. She said the candidates are Donna DeFrain, Baird Allen Brock, Eddie Osborne, Bob Watts, Chuck Norton, and Danielle Johnston. Each candidate in attendance was introduced. Jacobs moved said bill be passed to second reading by title. Roll was called for the adoption or rejection of said bill as follows: Yes: DeFrain, Jacobs, Rutt, Renfrow, Allen: No: none. Said bill was declared duly adopted and given Ordinance No. 5204.

Bill No. 1-9-16 being for an Ordinance Amending Section 23-371 Storage of Vehicles on City Streets Prohibited, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Warrensburg, was read for the first time by title. Acting Police Chief Tim Lowry said the Traffic Commission received complaints about trailers left on City streets over five days. He said the City does not have an ordinance that mentions trailers as a violation. Lowry said City Counselor Doug Harris amended the ordinance to include trailers. Rutt moved said bill be passed to second reading by title. Carried unanimously. Said bill was read a second time by title. Roll was called for the adoption or rejection of said bill as follows: Yes: DeFrain, Jacobs, Rutt, Renfrow, Allen. Absent: none. Said bill was declared duly adopted and given Ordinance No. 5205.

Under Mayoral appointments, Gabel said Mayor Allen would like to recommend the following reappointments to the Pedestrian and Cycling Task Force. Barbara Curtis, Bob Russell, county representatives; Chris Combs, school district appointment; and the reappointment of John Yost, county representative to the Tax Increment Financing Commission. DeFrain moved to approve the appointments. Yes: DeFrain, Jacobs, Rutt, Renfrow, Allen. No: none. Carried unanimously.

In the City Manager's report, Harold Stewart reminded Council members of the upcoming public hearing concerning Missouri American Water Company's proposed rate increase. He also said there are 27 applicants for the Police Chief position, and he expects a total of 30.

Stewart also said the Transportation Development District recommended the removal of Lot 2 because it is residential and senior housing.

DeFrain moved to close pursuant to Section 610.021 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, relating to:

- (1) Legal actions, causes of action or litigation involving the City and any confidential or privileged communication between the City and its representatives and its attorneys.
- (2) Leasing, purchase or sale of real estate where public knowledge might adversely affect the amount paid in the transaction.
- (12) Documents or any documents related to a negotiated contract until a contract is executed, or all proposals are rejected.

As there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
